managing director of OLT, a new contract was negotiated and signed. so that we can continue to hang our art on their wall space but with new pick up guidelines and policies. Starting this month, when a painting sells, the purchaser will be allowed to take his painting home the night of purchase, if they cannot come back at the end of play period. When paintings are sold, a red dot is put on the painting label. When you come in for your new submission and you see that your painting was sold and not collected, please advise Roger or me so that we can give you the purchaser's information. On the day of our painting exchange, if the painting is still at the OLT, the artist will be responsible for bringing their artwork back home, no matter what. OLT does not want to be liable for any damage that might occur to

paintings left behind. If you cannot come in, to pick up your painting, please make arrangements for a fellow artist to pick it up for you. They no longer want artwork in their box office or coat check room. The artist will be responsible for communicating with the purchaser to arrange to collect the artwork. OLT will be responsible for providing the purchaser's contact information to Roger. When you go in please make sure to bring back your painting if you notice that it is still there despite the fact that it is sold. We hope that this new arrangement will work better for everyone.

May 27, 2017 Art Submissions


May 29, 2017 Juried Awards Night



## The Advent of Abstraction: Russia, 1914-1923

09 Dec 2016 - 12 Mar 2017 Gallery C218



As part of our ongoing Masterpiece in Focus series, this exhibition centres on the emergence of the movement in Moscow from 1915 to 1917. Pulling together more than 20 works of the Russian avant-garde, highlights include a rare relief sculpture by Vladimir Tatlin and a major suprematist painting by Kazimir Malevich. Seen alongside El Lissitzky's *Proun 8 Stellungen (Proun 8 Positions)* (1923), from the national collection, the paintings, drawings, objects, manuscripts and photographs on display provide a rare opportunity to explore the development of abstraction in Russia: a decisive moment in the history of 20th-century art. *Organized by the National Gallery of Canada, with guest curator Andréi Nakov, Paris.*

# Your ticket on the Group of Seven's Algoma Railcar - Saturday 4 February

Follow the footsteps of the Group of Seven for a sketching and painting expedition in the Canadian wilderness. Create dry media and paint sketches using sound painting practices as they apply to the Canadian landscape: composition, simplification, colour and value - with a modernist edge! During annual trips to the North Shore of Lake Superior, members of the group evolved the style the Group of Seven is best known for: rich, decorative colours melding with deeply-felt perceptions of nature. Whether inspired by the stark and mystical landscapes of Lawren

Harris, the lyrical styles of J.E.H. MacDonald and Arthur Lismer or the consummate paint mastery of A.Y. Jackson, join us for a day in the company of this legendary group of Canadian painters.

## Our inner abstract – Saturday 11 February

What if we journeyed to inner space to paint what we feel on any given day? Drawing from this wonderful well of energy, the workshop focuses on creating a visual representation from within. For some, that might be a realistic image of some sort with the overlay of another, for others it might be a painting which comprises imagery both in and out of focus and yet others, something entirely abstract. Abstract art means many things to many people, invariably provoking reaction. This workshop will draw upon pure creativity and deep inspiration as well as colour theory as it relates to its emotional association. Let's amaze and surprise ourselves!

## Mysterious nocturnes: Whistler, Remington and more! - Saturday 25 February

Discover the creative potential of night scenes. The term nocturne was first borrowed from the world of music (denoting a movement evocative of night) in the 1800's by perhaps the greatest proponent of night scenes, James Abbott McNeill Whistler. Masters have explored the potential of nocturnes from Rembrandt's monumental "The Night Watch" to Frederic Remington's fascination with the American West. Nocturnes fill our senses with the potential of form and colour - hinted, but unstated: "Cold-hearted orb that rules the night, removes the colours from our sight. Red is grey, and yellow, white, but we decide which is right, and which is an illusion." (Peter Knight & The Moody Blues)




David Kearn is an artist and art educator based in Ottawa-Gatineau. His evocative portraits and figurative works in oil, acrylic, and watercolour are inspired by his love of people: "I'm constantly drawn to people, capturing reflections of the human condition" says David, continuing "My paintings are frequently inspired by an étude, often rough and ready, taken from life. I'm inspired by the quiet breaks, where a model appears to be taking a

rest from more dramatic poses. I search for the unusual, perhaps a feeling of internal dynamics."

David has completed many portrait commissions for private clients in Canada, the United States, and the U.K. In addition to an active studio practice, he runs art workshops and teaches drawing and painting courses at the Ottawa School of Art. David's approach balances control and technique with immediacy and spontaneity and shows how these can be

woven together to capture personality as well as likeness. He will demonstrate his approach in acrylic and comment on how his approach applies equally to other media, including watercolour and oil.
