Our speaker in February, artist and teacher Kevin Dodds, will give a talk on the marketing of art. Kevin is an owner of a gallery and studio in Arnprior as well as a new one that just opened in Ottawa. Documentaries on his work have appeared on PBS and other broadcasters. His work has appeared in worldwide exhibitions including the McCord Museum in Montreal, Plattsburg Museum of Art, and Canadian Museum of Civilization.
