## BOARD OF DIRECTOR DUTIES FOR VACANT POSITIONS

### **General**

All Directors should strive to attend the Executive Meeting, which is held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of the month (except July, August, November, December, and April). It is held in a boardroom on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Heron Rd. Community Centre starting at 6:00 PM and it finishes on or before 7:00 PM without exception.

All Directors are expected to assist in the preparation and execution of the Awards Nights tasks.

None of these positions take up a great deal of time but they are important if we want the Ottawa Art Association to continue as it has done for so many years. I know that all of us, including me, would just like someone else to do it so that we can concentrate on our art, but is that fair? We all have other responsibilities but that core group, who takes it on for the rest of us, age, get ill, move away, or have new responsibilities thrust upon them. What then, do they just walk away from OAA and let it fail or are new people willing to step up & do a share of the work? I sincerely hope it is the latter.

### **1<sup>st</sup> Vice President Duties/Responsibilities**

This position is essentially a training position for acceding to the position of President. It is expected that the 1<sup>st</sup> VP will be able to step in & run the Executive Meeting or take on a specific task if the President is unavailable. This means that the 1<sup>st</sup> VP will be made aware of all activities undertaken by the President. This includes the communications & arrangements with the Ottawa Little Theatre as well as with the City of Ottawa for the rental of the Heron Rd. Community Centre facilities.

### **Social Convener**

This position is of importance to all of us because this is the person responsible for providing the food at all of our meetings including the Awards Nights. Carol Brodtkin Sang has been handling this task beautifully for many years but has decided that it is time for her to turn the torch over to someone new. Carol will, I am sure, be more than happy to pass on her contacts and experience to whomever is willing to take this on. We would also be amenable to have a team of 2 or more people to handle this task in order to ensure backup.

### **Newsletter Editor**

This position is responsible for reminding the President to submit the President's Message on time and for receiving, from various sources, information on events of interest to our membership. Once all information is collected the Editor assembles the Newsletter & publishes it electronically as well as physically to those members who do not have Internet access. Meagan Dieroff has ably handled this task for the past year and will be able to answer any questions or to provide advice to any member willing to take on this task.
